# SCHOOL MENU

# ATTENDANCE

This is a reminder to contact the school office on the first day of your child's absence.

Attendance will be monitored closely this year for children falling below 96%. After consulting with our Attendance Officer, consideration will be given to issuing Penalty Notices for children whose attendance is 90% or below. If your child's attendance falls below an acceptable learning percentage, parents will be contacted. Our school target is 97%.

By way of example 97% attendance equates to 5 days absent from school.

Schools do have an obligation to inform you of this. Classroom doors will be open at 8.40am for registration at 8.50am. Any children that arrive after this time **must** report to the school office. Failure to do so may result in a missed attendance mark which results in the school office contacting you to check on attendance.











#### SCHOOL MEALS

Just a reminder that all KS1/Early Years children are entitled to universal free school meals. This is not compulsory but we do encourage you to take up this offer.

A reminder for KS2 (Yrs 3-6); dinner money has increased to £2.40. Please pay via the Parent Pay website with your unique password. Separate letters have been issued to children in Year 3 giving details of activation codes for Parent Pay.

that you are entitled to free
school meals (i.e. entitled to
Universal Credit), we

#### **HEADTEACHER'S NEWS**

Dear parents and carers,

Welcome back to what has been a very busy first few days back at school! We have been incredibly proud of how well the children have settled back into their new classes. I have visited all of the classrooms and have been extremely impressed by how well the children have adapted to their new classrooms and adults. Our new Early Years children have started their full days this week and have had lots of fun exploring their new learning areas. We are very excited to see how all of our children continue to grow and develop this year, academically and as young people. Thank you, too, for your support this week returning to pre-pandemic start times of 8:40am. This will enable us to resume interventions from 8:30am. If your child is invited to these, you should be receiving a letter within the next few days.

In assemblies this week we have revisited our Richmond mission statement of 'Building Leadership and Character, Together We Will LEARN', with LEARN standing for Learn, Enjoy, Achieve, Respect and Nurture. These are values which we all share at Richmond. We also focused on the importance of working together as a team, celebrating differences and valuing everyone. You may hear your child begin to use the phrase 'Everyone different, everyone welcome' as it something we will be sharing in school regularly this year.

We have already had lots of exciting learning in school since the beginning of term. Many of the year groups have started their first Connected Learning theme and have had their Memorable Experience day. Hedgehog bread baking, Victorian prison punishments, mummification (of tomatoes!) and a very messy 'Muck, Mess and Mixtures' day to name a few. This year, we have developed our Connected Curriculum theses to begin with a 'big question' to explore. This will support the development of children's enquiry skills, encouraging them to ask and answer questions and providing a purpose for learning. At the end of every theme, we will be celebrating with a community focused event. Watch this space for art galleries, charity fund raisers, links with the local care homes and many more.
