On Tuesday evening last week, we were delighted to see our Trust Poetry Competition winners perform their poems at Thomas Estley Community College. Each of the poems was based around the theme of 'All Different, All Equal' and links into our No Outsiders learning on diversity. Each of the children did an amazing job of performing their poems to the audience and received a certificate from Mrs Collins, Success Academy Trust Leader. We were extremely proud of all of the children for their carefully considered poetry, which will be published in a Trust Anthology book shortly.





In addition to the Trust Poetry competition this term, all of the children entered a design into the Trust Christmas card competition. These were judged by the Art and Design leaders across the Trust, with one winner selected from each school. The cards have been printed and will be distributed within the community. I am pleased to announce the winner from Richmond is Suzanna in year 5, with a wonderful Christmas design.

Year 1 had a very exciting week of learning last week. They began the week with a recreation of the Great Fire of London. With some help from our site team, we burned down our 'London houses' to show the children what happened during the fire. The





children were fascinated to see how quickly the fire spread across the houses and linked this to their learning about London. In R.E this week, year 1 children made their own Christingles. They learnt about the symbolism behind each of the parts and thought about the message of hope it brings during Advent.

Year 2 children made a very exciting discovery in the school grounds last week. On the field, behind a large tree, they uncovered a dragon egg! During the day, the egg hatched and Mr Middleton – one of our site team – was left very shocked by the incident. The children were captivated by the discovery and spent the day keeping their eye out for any further dragon sightings around school. They also produced some brilliant story writing based on a hero saving everyone from the dragon.





It was lovely to welcome you all into school on Friday for our Christmas Fayre. Thank you to those who were able to attend. Santa and his elf were certainly very busy and enjoyed meeting all of the children.


