
Last week, we took part in a range of activities to celebrate Children's Mental Health week, under the theme of 'Let's Connect'. We especially loved making connections with other children in different year groups, sharing stories and playing games. Some of our crafts are now on display in our 'Feel Good Wood', too.



Yesterday, year 6 hosted a special end of unit roadshow, to showcase all of their Frozen Kingdom learning. We invited scientists and teachers from The Hinckley School,

De Montford University and Leicester University to join us. Our visitors were incredibly impressed with the children's knowledge of the polar regions and their presentation skills. The children worked extremely hard to create a range of games and activities to share their new information. Thank you to all of our visitors for making this a really special event for our children.





Children in year 4 welcomed visitors from Hinckley Museum into school last week. We learnt that 'Ley' means 'clearing', so 'Hinckley' means a clearing owned by a man named Hink. We also found out that places such as Stoney Stanton and Earl Shilton are Anglo-Saxon villages, and Blaby, Enderby and Elmesthorpe are Viking villages. Hinckley is on the border of Anglo-Saxon's Mercia kingdom and the Viking's Danelaw so we have lots of Viking and Anglo-Saxon history in our local area. Finally, we looked at pictures of where Hinckley Castle would have been at the top of Castle Street. The children also loved sharing their Anglo-Saxon knowledge with the visitors and were very proud of how much they knew about settlements and place names.

Last Friday, year 5 were visited by Tom the Tale Teller (who looked suspiciously like Emmy's dad!). The children were enthralled by his oral re-telling of The Crystal Ball, which involved bravery, magic and challenges for the hero to overcome. This fitted perfectly with their end of unit English unit on journey tales. Thank you for joining us, Tom!





On Friday 10th February, children from year 4 had the opportunity to take part in a 'Skip to be Fit' workshop. During the afternoon, the children were shown different skipping routines, as well as taking part in different challenges. They talked about the importance of being active and the benefits to everyone's wellbeing. We look forward to the group sharing their new skipping skills with the rest of school during Active Lunchtimes.

Richmond playgroup needs you!

Richmond playgroup is a well-established setting for nurturing and supporting the development of all the children in our care, as well as providing and offering stimulating, fun and meaningful opportunities and experiences to set the foundations for early education.

The playgroup is overseen by a committee whose role it is to ensure that the setting fulfils all the requirements laid down by Ofsted and the Local Authority. The responsibility for the staff within the setting and the financial security of the playgroup is also part of the committee's brief. The committee consists of a Chair, Vice Chair, Treasurer and Secretary. We have an imminent need for additional committee members and we are looking for volunteers to join our Playgroup Committee. It is a legal requirement for the organisation to have these members, and without them, the playgroup will not be able to fulfil its duty and therefore cannot run.

As a volunteer, you would be required to meet once a term for around an hour to discuss the ongoing running of the playgroup. You do not need to have had any previous experience/expertise in being part of a committee, just a willingness to support Richmond Playgroup behind the scenes.
